I don't think any of us anticipated the way 2022 began, however resilience and adaptability have continued to shine through with families making adjustments wherever possible. The teaching team shared the care for children of essential workers attending during the first two weeks however everyone was keen to welcome all children on the 7th February.

The front courtyard was a buzz with children and parents sharing a range of feelings from joy that the day has finally arrived to mixed feelings of excitement and worry which is so normal for this time of year. I joined in with amusement with one set of parents who high-fived each other that they managed to get to the front gate before letting a few tears slip away!

We hope you have had a happy introduction to Mitchelton Pre-Schooling Centre and trust that you and your family will settle into kindy life quickly and feel a sense of belonging to MPC. The initial phase of getting to know 'what to do' will pass very quickly as you and your child will soon have it mastered. Parents and children separating and saying good-bye is very smooth for some and can be challenging for others. Time and practice often eases this process as the teaching teams support individual children (and parents) to move from moments of sadness to feelings of calm and excitement. It takes time to get to know the pattern of the day and meet other children and families. Becoming familiar with everyday kindy life will continue for some time and it is important to remember that everyone at MPC is here to help. We expect that there will be very many questions, expressions of joy and worry. Please remember that we believe that there are no silly questions at MPC! Teachers are always happy to talk with you however drop off pick up times are busy with greeting and farewelling all children and families. You are welcome to wait for a few minutes in the afternoons, email or call later in the day.

Starting kindy, like many changes, can be a big thing! Even for children who are familiar with walking through the front gate, there are changes with different children, group dynamics, teaching styles and the like. Sharing space, equipment and adult attention takes on a whole new meaning. Some children may also be adjusting to changes in their feelings as they find their place and space within a group of children. Sometimes challenges occur. Our general response is to explain, validate feelings, support and allow time for children to adjust. As always, individual differences are considered which sometimes determines an alternative response.

These first few weeks are a really important time for teaching teams, children and families to get to know each other. We ask that you consider the following:

- We are aware that for some families, dropping off and collecting your kindy child has to be co-ordinated with other children, however we encourage you to arrive as close as possible to your group's starting and finishing times. This enables your child to settle into the day and make connections with other children as they decide where to play. This will also help with car parking as each group should have enough time to leave before the next group is ready to start.
- Please remember to check your parent pockets on your unit verandah and noticeboards for information. Teachers
 write a few comments about the day to give you some 'conversation starters' with your child which will either be
 emailed or available to read near your child's sign in/out folder.
- Getting into a routine takes time....please don't worry if initially, lunches are not all eaten, or if your child seems unusually tired, cranky or doesn't want to tell you anything about his/her day. Your child may share information later in the day when relaxed (sometimes in the bath or while reading a story at night).
- Please send a non-insulated lunch box as insulated bags prevent the cold air from keeping lunches fresh when placed in the fridge.

We hope you enjoy the year ahead at Mitchelton Pre-Schooling Centre and we look forward as a staff team to getting to know all our children's families.

MPC's COVID-19 Safe Plan (extract)

To read the full plan, please refer to the Policy folder in the central foyer. **Guiding Principles:**

- Seek updated information and respond to all Health Department directives.
- Be flexible, adaptive and positive.
- Focus on well-being of all stakeholders- children, families, staff members.
- Provide calm, accurate and regular communications to all stakeholders.
- Monitor, review and improve practices.

Key strategies to reduce the spread of COVID-19 include:

- To facilitate 1.5 m physical distancing for adults, starting times for each unit are staggered and entrance to each unit is specified:
 - \Rightarrow Unit 1 is via the front courtyard;
 - \Rightarrow Unit 2 is via their front courtyard;
 - \Rightarrow Unit 3 enters through the central courtyard and gate;
 - \Rightarrow B&A Care through the central courtyard and use relevant gates to access child's unit.
- Families are encouraged to arrive just prior to their child's starting time;
- Mask wearing for adults as mandated;
- Hand-washing for children is taught and supervised;
- Keeping unwell children at home;
- Staff to stay at home if unwell and abide with directives in relation to COVID testing;
- Teaching teams to monitor health of attending children. Parent will be contacted to collect unwell child.

Summary of a couple of policies ...

Lady Gowrie, which is MPC 's Central Governing Body, regularly updates policies. These policies are then reviewed and discussed by the staff team and committee members along with interested parents before being adopted. The essential information from many policies is included in the Parent Information Handbook and all policies are available for viewing in the central foyer. We also endeavour to highlight new policy information in the newsletter from time-to-time.

Immunisation: It is strongly recommended that all children have their immunisation schedule up to date before

commencing at our Centre. In the event of an outbreak of a vaccine preventable disease, all families will be notified. Any non-immunised children will be required to be withdrawn from the centre until the risk has passed in accordance with the National Health and Medical Research Council exclusion guidelines.

All parents are requested to inform a staff member if their child or other members of the immediate family

contracts a vaccine preventable disease. Historically, MPC has had an immunisation rate of enrolled children higher than 97% with a small percentage of children not-immunised for a variety of reasons.

Please ensure that MPC has your child's updated immunisation record. For further information, please refer to the Immunisation Policy located in the Gowrie Policy folder in the central foyer.

When a child is unwell:

Where a child is showing any flu like symptoms (fever, shortness of breath, sore throat, coughing) their parent/guardian is to be called and immediate collection of the child from the service requested. Staff continue to complete an IITI Record as per normal procedures. An isolation space where the child can still be supervised and supported will be established. Where a child has a temperature reading **of 38.0 or higher** this initiates a call to the parent/guardian asking for the child to be collected.

TERM ONE FEES and B & A CARE PERMANENT BOOKING INVOICES

Invoices for Kindy Fees and B & A Care (if applicable) have been emailed to all families and are due for payment by 18th February. Please check your spam/junk folder if you have not received it and move to your usual inbox so you don't miss future emails from us.

Fees can either by paid by cash, direct deposit into our bank account (preferred option) or credit card (a 1% surcharge applies).

If you would like to pay your fees in instalments during the term, please see Chris or Sue in the office for a "Fee Payment Plan", or email the office and we can send the form through to you.

Health Care Cards/Pensioner Concession Cards/DVA Gold/White cards

The Queensland Government offers subsidies to families who have a health care card or equivalent concession card by providing a subsidy to our Centre to reduce the cost of their child's kindy fees, or where children identify as ATSI.

If you or your child have one of the above Government Concession cards, and you haven't advised us on your enrolment documentation please drop into the office.

OFFICE HOURS

The office will open on **Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 8.30am to 3.00pm** for all enquiries, purchases of merchandise and payment of fees.

AUTHORISATIONS TO COLLECT CHILDREN. If you would like to add additional persons to the list of nominated adults who can collect your child please see your child's teacher or Chris in the office to complete the required form. Children can **only** be collected by persons listed on your child's file.

- Arrange carpooling with friends once your child is familiar with the centre.
- If you're planning to stay for a short time in the morning, please DO NOT park in the 10 min zone.
- Please consider parents with babies and young children with prams.

At Mitchelton Pre-Schooling Centre we view children as individuals and social learners. News from Before & After Kindy Care....

The B&A staff team are looking forward to getting to know you and your children.

Before and After Kindy Care aims to provide a relaxed caring environment for children to enjoy before and/or after their regular day. All children attending MPC are welcome to use this additional service on either a permanent basis or casual (just for the occasion when you aren't able to drop off or collect at your usual children's day program hours)

Hours of operation for the program are:-

Every morning7.00am to 9.00amEvery afternoon2.15pm to 5.30pm

If you wish to make a permanent booking, please call in to the office to complete a "permanent booking" form. Permanent bookings receive a 25% discount off the Casual Rate. **Fees for Permanent OK Care bookings will be invoiced and payable in advance.** Alternatively you may use this service on a casual basis – please add your child's name to any session you wish them to attend in the B & A sign in/out folder in the back courtyard. Invoices for casual use will be issued twice per term and payment will be required within 7 days.

A QIP helps providers to document the strengths of their services and to recognise areas for improvement. MPC developed a QIP which reflects our unique context and the community.

Kindy on Saturday is quite different to sharing the space with a big group of children. Their parent/s and maybe siblings are also there too! This may be an opportunity for your child to become even more familiar with our lovely kindy spaces and for you as parents to chat with other families in this area.

Playgroup is open to any families with children up to 5 years (they don't have to be enrolled at MPC), so feel free to let your friends and neighbours know about our Saturday playgroup.

Have you seen the Parent Library?

Our Parent Library is tucked away on the left as you enter the foyer. There are fabulous books which prompt thinking about a broad range of topics centred around children and families. Topics include:

- Healthy eating Food
- Supporting children's learning
- Diverse needs
- Gardening/Sustainability
- Guiding children's behaviour
- Personal growth and understandings
- Books to read with children. (These books are useful to prompt conversations about sickness, death, positive mindset, perseverance, different ways of being, being brave, managing anger and other emotions, trying new foods, PSTD and many

more.)

If you are here early...



Please feel free to explore the front courtyard if you are here a few minutes before your child's starting time. You mind find some stingless native bees busy at work.

There are books to read in the front meeting place or comfy couch.

Have you seen more re-cycling possibilities at MPC?

Building sustainability understandings is very important to us at MPC. Your children are already learning to sort fruit and vegetable scraps and any other rubbish they may have. Option include:

- Food for the worms and compost bins
- Containers we can wash and use for collage
- Soft plastics (which we take to Coles/Woolworths collection stations)
- Rubbish which can't be re-cycled.

It is incredible pleasing to note that many children are bringing lunchboxes with little or no packaging. Thank you families.

In the central courtyard, we have another re-cycling stations with containers for collecting other materials that can be re-cycled including:

- Toothbrushes and toothpaste
- Bread tags
- Coffee pods—Aluminimum only please.

Once the container is full, these recyclables are packed and sent to Terra Cycle Australia for processing into other items. This link provides more information <u>www.terracycle.com/en-AU/</u>.

As an added bonus the kindy receives points which can be converted to donations. MPC will donate to Ronald McDonald House at Herston.

Putting these items in these containers is another great opportunity for you to talk with your child about re-cycling and the positive ways they can contribute to 'looking after our world'. Who know where this knowledge and everyday practices will take your children. The ripple effect can be very powerful!
